National – District Committee Restructuring

- CEPAT = Clinical and Emerging Practices AT Committee
This committee is combining the Clinical, Industrial, Corporate committee and the Committee on Reimbursement. Hawaii needs a representative for this committee
- All District Career Assistance Committees have been dissolved and all job postings must be submitted to the NATA office.
- The Women in Athletic Training Committee will be dissolved and will work as an interest group striving to improve quality of life issues for all NATA members.
- The College/University Athletic Training Students Committee is being replaced by the Athletic Training Student Committee. Chris Schmidt will continue to work as an advisor to the committee, but this committee will be chaired by a district athletic training student. This person will also serve as an ex-officio

member of the board.

- The Young Professionals Committee, chaired by Rachael Cunningham, is a new NATA founded committee working with younger NATA members. Goals will include retaining membership and helping the NATA address the professional needs of our younger members.
- The Educational Multimedia Committee has been eliminated.
- The NATA WebMaster Committee will become an advisory group. An effort is being made to coordinate all NATA, District and State websites to have a common format. This is an ongoing effort and will require close work with each state and district.
